Review of last year – what did we achieve? What impact did it have on our school family?

Last year, we formed as a new group. We had training with Cath Anselm from CARITAS. We learned more about Catholic Social Teaching and matched that to our mission statement - we are kind and follow Jesus. We try to be compassionate and help those in need. The training has helped us in our role to lead our school in doing small things with great love.

We invited Leo and Jane in from CAFOD and they talked to us and the whole school about being a voice for the poor. Following their visit, we wanted to help the Sudan Crisis appeal and so we organised and held a silly hat day, raising £70 and putting our love into action.

Last year, we also raised money for St Joseph's Penny, CAFOD, RED Door and Urban Outreach.

In June, some of our group travelled to London and spoke about aspects of Catholic Social Teaching in the Oracy for Advocacy programme. Freya spoke about accessibility issues and the rights of people with disabilities and Haashim spoke about poverty and people who were homeless. This opportunity was important because we learned to use our voices to speak up for others and could show people it is possible to make the world a better place for everybody.
